IIS Publication Grant Process Overview

WHAT IS AN IIS PUBLICATION GRANT PROGRAM?

The IIS Publication Grant Program allows an investigator, upon completion of his or her own study, request publication support from Biosense Webster, Inc.

Support can be provided in the form of in-kind medical writing services or through funding to assist with the costs of publication.

Publication support may be provided for the development of abstracts, abstract presentations (poster or oral presentations), and/or manuscripts intended for submission to peer-reviewed scientific congresses or journals.

SUPPORTING SCIENTIFIC ADVANCEMENT

The program promotes the expansion and dissemination of scientific knowledge in areas of mutual interest to both Biosense Webster, Inc. and the Investigator/Institution. All investigators are welcome to apply, even if the research to be published was not funded by Biosense Webster, Inc.

OVERALL PROCESS



STEP 1: Investigator/Institution submits a publication application with complete publication plan post-study completion to <https://jnjmd-iis-portal.idea-point.com>

STEP 2: Biosense Webster, Inc. reviews the scientific merit of the study design, publication plan, and fit with strategic research priorities. If the application is accepted, the process moves to Step 3

STEP 3: Contract negotiations begin for in-kind financial support

STEP 4: Publication development begins

STEP 5: Publication is submitted to either a peer-reviewed medical/scientific congress or journal

THE ROLE OF THE SPONSOR-INVESTIGATOR/INSTITUTION

The Sponsor-Investigator/Institution must ensure the study and/or data collection was conducted in accordance with Good Clinical Practice (GCP) for Medical Devices: ICH GCP E6 and ISO14155 and regulatory requirements, whenever applicable.

As a condition of participation in the IIS Publication Support Program, the study investigator is required to submit the final version of the publication to a peer-reviewed medical or scientific congress and/or journal for publication.

THE ROLE OF BIOSENSE WEBSTER, INC.

- Review the IIS Publication Grant application for potential approval
- Communicate decision to Sponsor-Investigator/Institution
- Contract with Sponsor-Investigator/Institution and provide publication support in the form of in-kind medical writing services or funding to assist with the cost of such services

PUBLICATION EXPECTATIONS

- Focused on scientific exchange
- Objectivity and fair balance
