Eligibility for IIS Publication Grant program

- Publication support needed after completion of study
- Research results to be submitted to a peer-reviewed medical journal or scientific congress
- Research results must not have been previously presented (in case of congress submission) or published (in case of manuscripts)



What to expect

Step 1

Investigator/Institution submits request to the JnJ IIS Portal with complete publication plan after study completion and prior to manuscript development or submission

Step 2

JnJ MedTech Electrophysiology reviews the scientific merit, publication plan, and fit with strategic research priorities. If the application is accepted, the process moves to STEP 3

Step 3

Execution of research agreement, if required

Step 4

Publication development & submission to a peer-reviewed medical journal/ scientific congress

In scope of the Publication Grant request

- Development of abstracts, poster or oral presentations and/or manuscripts
- Third-party statistical analysis
- Publication submission fees
- Open-access journal fees
- Other publication-related expenses
